Philanthropy Notes

In the last few months, donations to music education took centre stage. Last month we reported Toronto businessman Seymour Schulich's \$20-million endowment of the McGill Faculty of Music. Here is more.

Royal Conservatory receives \$5M gift

lan Ihnatowycz, president and chief executive of Acuity Funds Ltd. and Acuity Investment Management, and his wife, optometrist Dr. Marta Witer, have donated \$5 million to The Royal Conservatory of Music. Part of the gift, \$1 million, will be used to create the Ian Ihnatowycz Piano Scholars Program, an elite program for pianists to help create the next generation of Glenn Goulds, funding 5 to 8 students annually. The balance brings to \$68 million the RCM's \$85-million building renovation campaign. Ihnatowycz, Witer and their children were all students of the Royal Conservatory. In honour of the donation, the historic wing of the building will be named Ihnatowycz Hall.

Fine Arts Faculty receives \$1.2 Million Donation

University of Calgary alumnus John Lefebvre has donated \$1.2 million to the Fine Arts Faculty at the U of C. Lefebvre studied law at the U of C in the late 1970s. During that time he was active in the music department. He believes those musical experiences were crucial to his success in his law studies. He made this gift because, he says, "Art is a way for people to step up and express themselves as human beings. Every time you do that, it makes you a better person. And every time you hear or see the expression of somebody else, it touches you, and you become a better person. Cultured people are compassionate people."

The donation will be used to establish four new entrance scholarships for Fine Arts students, one each in music, drama, dance and art. It will also fund the John Peter Lee Roberts Distinguished Professorship in Fine Arts, the Joyce and Quentin Doolittle Fine Arts Studio, and special projects. KH

Donation levels playing field at Yale Music School

The Yale School of Music has recently announced it will be removing the financial burden of tuition on its undergraduate and graduate students effective September 2006. This announcement came in response to a \$100-million (U.S.) donation from an anonymous source, which effectively eliminated the university's financial need to continue to collect the current \$23,750 (U.S.) per year in tuition from its students. "It will be an important wake-up call to all schools that graduate students, by nature, are poor and need help," said Richard Killmer, an oboe professor at the University of Rochester's Eastman School of Music: "When a precedent is set by a major school of music, others are going to have to look at the possibility and re-evaluate their fundraising efforts to go this way." Indiana University Music School receives \$40.6 million

The Indiana University (IU) Music School will be renamed the Jacobs School of Music following a \$40.6 million donation from IU alumna Barbara Barrow Jacobs in memory of her husband, David H. Jacobs Sr., also an alumnus. While \$20 million will go towards graduate fellowships, another \$10 million is earmarked for undergraduate scholarships, amounts matched by the university, thereby enabling IU to recruit the top music students in the world. The remaining amount will endow four faculty positions and pay for special lectures, projects and festivals. The Jacobs family is renowned for its real estate developments, having built malls in 14 states, developed office buildings and hotels, and owned the Cleveland Indians from 1986 to 1999. Their son David Ir. studied music at IU.

\$1 Million Gift to the Vancouver Symphony

The Vancouver Symphony Orchestra has received a \$1 million donation from local philanthropist Martha Lou Henley. The gift is for the VSO's Endowment Campaign, which aims to raise \$20 million in total, \$8 million in this phase. The endowment fund will provide ongoing revenue to ensure long-term stability. This is the largest single donation the VSO has ever received.

Henley has provided support to over 75 arts organisations in the Vancouver area. In 2004 she donated \$1 million to the Vancouver Opera. Her extensive philanthropy has been recognized through many awards, including the Lescarbot Award for Volunteerism, the Commemorative Medal for the 125th Anniversary of Canadian confederation, the Ramon John Hnatyshyn Award for Volunteerism of the Governor General's Awards, an award for philanthropy and voluntarism from the BC Arts Council, the Commemorative Medal for the Queen's Golden Jubilee, and the Vancouver Arts Awards' 2004 Honoree for Philanthropy

Manitoba Chamber Orchestra

Farm equipment magnate John Buhler and his wife, Bonnie, have donated \$250,000 to the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra's endowment fund, previously at \$226,000. The orchestra hopes for a matching donation from the Winnipeg Foundation and Canadian Heritage to bring the fund to \$750,000. Buhler, who donates \$1 million per year to worthy causes, hopes to see the orchestra play regularly at Buhler Hall, in his hometown of Gretna, Manitoba. **CB**

Met Opera radio broadcasts saved

The future of the New York metropolitan Opera's legendary radio broadcasts has been under threat since Chevron-Texaco withdrew financial support in 2003. A majority of the broadcast's \$6 million seasonal budget will now be donated by Toll Brothers, a Horsham, Pennsylvania-based luxury home building company. The donation will ensure the survival of the broadcasts for four more years.
